The SIMG WBA

The Workplace Based Assessment (WBA) for International Medical Graduate Specialists (SIMG) is one component of the assessment of an SIMG who has been assessed by the College as being Substantially Comparable (SC) to an Australian or New Zealand trained specialist anaesthetist. The WBA is conducted by two Fellows of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists. The SIMG WBA aims to assess professional performance of the SIMG against a standard that would be reasonably expected of a specialist anaesthetist who has been trained in Australia or New Zealand. You have agreed to attend an interview with one of our assessors to provide multi-source feedback on your experience working with the SIMG. The purpose of the multi-source feedback is to gather information from a range of members of staff which increases the breadth of information about the candidate's performance. The areas of discussion during the multi-source feedback interview are formulated around the ANZCA roles of; medical expert, communicator, collaborator, manager, health advocate, scholar and professional. The interview may cover the following as applicable to each interviewee:

- · clinical skills and attitudes.
- · patient care,
- · behavioural skills and attitudes,
- general discussion regarding the SIMG being assessed.
